



Athletes give rivals the Slipper

NICK Bromley backed long-shot Golden Slipper winner Phelan Ready on Saturday then led his UTS Northern Suburbs Athletics men's team to victory at the National Club Championship in Adelaide.

Bromley, of St Ives, won the division-A 800m and division-B 400m, with UTS Norths winning 13 of 20 men's events.

The club won the opening five track events, including the 4x100m relay.

Chatswood's Lewis Clark and Lindfield's Robbie Baskin dominated their 100m events, with Pavel Pankuch and Paul Crowe brilliant in shot put.

Sean Barnes, of Killara, and Rob Dunn, of Roseville, won the long jump events and Anthony Camilleri easily won the javelin.

It's the second time UTS Norths have won the men's National Club Championship, also winning in 2006.
